

## COL Frank (Scott) Victor

Director, Distance Education Department, Command and General Staff College

Colonel Scott Victor, born in New Hartford, NY and a life-long native of New York, was commissioned as a second lieutenant in 1997, after graduating from Brockport State University with a Bachelor's of Science degree in History. He also holds a Master's of Arts in Administration from Central Michigan University and a Master's of Strategic Studies from the U.S. Army War College.

Scott's duty assignments span time in the Active Army (six years), time as a traditional reservist (three years) and twelve years of service in the Active Guard Reserve (AGR) program. His early career was spent in Mannheim, Germany beginning as a Heavy Equipment Transport Platoon Leader with the 377th Truck Company; Forward OIC, 377<sup>th</sup> HET, Taszar, Hungary; HHC XO and Battalion S-1 with the 181<sup>st</sup> Transportation Battalion in Germany. In 2002 Scott transferred to the US Army Reserve and spent the next three years as the company commander for Headquarters Company, 300<sup>th</sup> Area Support Group, including a year deployed in Iraq.

COL Victor transferred to the Active Guard Reserve program in 2006. His first AGR assignment began in Indianapolis, IN with 8<sup>th</sup> Army CONUS as the G-3 Operations Plans Officer. His follow on assignments include: Support Operations Logistics Plans Officer (310<sup>th</sup> ESC); Deputy G-4, First Army Division (East), Fort Meade, Maryland; Deputy Inspector General, 102<sup>nd</sup> Training Division, Fort Leonard Wood, MO; Battalion Commander, 1-351<sup>st</sup> Brigade Support Battalion (OC/T), Fort McCoy, WI; and presently serving as the Director of the Distance Education Department, CSGC, Fort Leavenworth, KS.

COL Victor's professional military education includes the Transportation Officer Basic Course (Fort Eustis, VA); Captain's Career Course (Fort Lee, VA); the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College (Fort Leavenworth, KS); and the U.S. Army War College (Carlisle Barracks, PA); and the Air Assault School (Fort Campbell, KY).

COL Victors' awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, the Army Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, the NATO Medal, and the Operation Iraqi Freedom Campaign Medal.

Scott and his wife, Karen have been married more than 22 years and they have two children, Nicholas and Gabrielle.
