- Mr. Peter Wood, is a senior analyst with the Foreign Military Studies Office (FMSO), Army TRADOC G2. He has contributed to FMSO's *Operational Environment Watch* publication since 2018. He previously led a team of China OSINT researchers at a D.C.-based defense contractor and serving as Editor of *China Brief*, at the Jamestown Foundation. He has an M.A. from the Hopkins-Nanjing Center for Chinese and American Studies (HNC) and a B.A. in Political Science from Texas Tech University. He is proficient in Chinese.
- LTC Joshua Stephenson, is an assistant professor in the Department of Joint, Interagency, and Multinational Operations (DJIMO), U.S. Army CGSC.

His education includes M.A in Strategic Studies, Naval Postgraduate School; B.A. in History, Benedictine College. LTC Stephenson is an Army South Asia Foreign Area Officer.
