








China's Trade Ties with Indian Ocean Countries





Chinese Port Financing and Construction in Indian Ocean Region














Tripoint of U.S. Commands in Indian Ocean




The Myth of Pacifism

- Defeated in WWII, Japan is occupied and adopts Pacifist Constitution in 1947
 - 1950 Japan rearms
 - 1960 U.S. and Japan sign new Mutual Security Treaty
 - Yoshida Doctrine and Domestic Anti-Militarism
- Abe Shinzō, prime minister of Japan, 2006-2007, 2012-2020
 - Proposes the Quad in 2007, champions it again in 2012, "a democratic security diamond"
 - Announces Japan's strategy of a Free and Open Indo-Pacific (FOIP) in 2016, the U.S. adopts this vision in 2019










Renewed FOIP, Stronger Japan, Hopes for Stronger Quad

- Four Wars
 - WWII, disarms
 - Korean War, rearms
 - First Gulf War, loosens hade
 - Russia's invasion of Ukraine, commits to 2% of GDP Defense Budget
- Four PMs
 - Yoshida Shigeru
 - Kishi Nobusuke
 - Abe Shinzō
 - Kishida Fumio



Organization and Capabilities



Source documents provide guidance for training in three broad areas.

- Core Cultural Competencies: Core cultural competencies include areas such as understanding culture, applying organizational awareness, cultural
 perspective taking, and cultural adaptability.
- 2) Regional/Technical Competencies: Regional/technical competencies deal with applying regional information and operating in a regional environment.
- 3) Leader/Influence Functions: Leader/influence functions include strategic (cultural) agility, (cultural) systems thinking, cross-cultural influences, organizational cultural competence, and utilizing interpreters/advisors.
