CASO Panel "Strategic Perspectives of China, North Korea and India towards Russia- Ukraine Conflict." (15 September 2022) Senior Leader's Opening Remarks

Good afternoon, and thanks for attending the first Cultural and Area Studies panel of the academic year.

For those unaware, the Cultural and Area Studies Office, known as CASO, works with multiple partner organizations to identify important topics in support of U.S. national security and the National Defense Strategy objectives across the spectrum of conflict.

More recently, in June of this year, Secretary of Defense Austin reaffirmed the United States' position to stand by its allies, including Taiwan, in response to the Shangri-La Dialogue, Asia's premier security gathering.

- 1) What are the potential threats from China, Russia, and North Korea to our or our allies' national security?
